The committee is in the process of revising the Planning Board schedule to 2 regular meetings. However, there are concerns over cost vs. the anticipated benefit in time savings. Also looking at alternative ways to hold meetings, just to set public hearing's bringing the submittal deadline back to 2 weeks and updating the Land Use table, Adding/updating definitions to better match the types of business that are occurring, Give Staff more authority to review Site Plans, Architectural Design Review, and signs

are other issues they are looking to revise. Gary stated that he would like to schedule another small committee meeting in order to flesh-out new ideas.

NYSERDA has promoted use of a State-wide permit application form for residential solar installations. The Town adopted it as part of their participation in the Clean Energy Communities Program. Gary will bring the information to next month's meeting to see if the Village Board is interested in adapting it.

Engineering – Niles Pierson

Mr. Cappelli asked about water budget concerns. The amount of labor in August for Dina's project was a lot of the issue. The bill has been paid. Water has borrowed money from Sewer but needs to be paid back before June 1. Fund balance for water is a negative \$18,000. New IMA will be in effect on January 1st.

Mr. Cappelli asked any news on the bucket truck? Mr. Pierson said he has been checking into an IMA with Little Valley and using their truck and they in turn will be borrowing our new sewer truck. He stated that the DPW had rented a bucket truck to start hanging the Christmas decorations at the cost of \$800 for three days.

The Town has been granted a \$250,000 SAM Grant for the Town and Village Hall. The money when received will be used to replace the windows and doors.

Mill street side-walk to McKinley drive will be started on Thursday. Next month finalizing water and sewer district and will need to adopt either at the November or December meeting. This should not need a public hearing.

6760 Holiday Valley Road Water-Sewer Adjustment Request. Toilets were broken and did go thru the sewer. No relief has been given.

Town Engineering Budget Approval - \$270,000 last year. New amount for next year \$189,785.
