Call meeting to order

Continuance of Public Hearing on Local law #3 to amend the Noise Ordinance

Mr. Stanton stated that the changes are as follows;

Section 3. Prohibited Acts

a) No premises shall emit, and no person

11. between the hours of 10:00p.m. and 7:00a.m., except with regard to a lawfully operating to commercial premises at which the generation of humanly audible sound beyond the property line of the premises upon which the noise source is generated, between the hours of 11:00p.m. and 7:00 a.m. shall be considered prima facie evidence of a violation of this ordinance.

12. Same as above added after background.

Section 3. Exceptions

e) Noise generated by the operation of a generator providing emergency power in response to an outage not caused by the failure to pay the provider.

Section 4. Penalties

The owner of any property from which noise is generated exceeding the thresholds of this Local Law, as well as any person.

Mayor Burrell added that the Sheriff dept will get a copy of the local law.

Short Term Rental Update

Mr. Cappelli introduced Susan Dowd our new prosecutor. We still have questions that need to be addressed stated Mr. Cappelli. Any applications that have come in if not meeting the criteria will be rejected. Canadian notary will be accepted. Only thing remaining in place is the moratorium. To recap we put a moratorium in place at the end of March, basically says because of COVID and executive orders. A lot has changed since and the moratorium has been extended until December 31st. Kelly Fredrickson has received around 6 applications. What we need to decide, do we need the moratorium? Can we issue licensees or not? Removing the moratorium would help to be able to prosecute those if need be. Mr. Bush stated that he agrees that we need to stick with November 1st date and

supports removing the moratorium. Mr. Imhoff agrees with lifting the moratorium and enforcing the guidelines. All agreed it all comes down to enforcement. Adding a letter when Kelly sends back the license to guide them to the governor's guidelines should help. Mr. Lowes is in agreement with lifting the moratorium and go with the governors guidelines. Mr. Stanton stated that he was checking the New York State website and he sees no problem with removing the moratorium. Ms. Dowd agreed that we should remove the moratorium.
