• Supervisor's Report

• Shared Services Meeting

Supervisor McAndrew reviewed some of the ideas that were proposed at the Shared Services meeting that may be of interest to Ellicottville:

- Water/Sewer Consolidation - underway with the Village.

- Joint Copier lease - would not save the Town money.

- DPW Purchases on County bids - the Highway Supervisor will keep track of purchases made through County bids and the savings will be quantified.

- Human Resource Training - The County would provide annual training and policy development. General consensus that this would be a good idea.

- Dog Control - Not interested at this time

- Multijurisdictional Hazard Mitigation - to be used as a resource in addition to the Town's engineering department.

- Shared Code Enforcement with Mansfield - not cost effective for Mansfield at this time.

- Reassessment of Real Property - Probably not - Assessor will address.

- Joint Equipment Purchase - parts purchased through the Catt. Co. DPW, quantify savings.

- Maintenance of Vehicles - will quantify savings.

- Administrative Assistance for disaster Recovery - the County will help with paperwork and assist in recovering funds.

- Bucket truck to be purchased with the Village of Ellicottville -The Village is in need of a Bucket truck and the Town could use it for tree trimming, etc. It would cost each municipality \$18,000 plus 1/2 of \$7,000 for insurance and inspection per year. Maintenance can also be expensive. The Board questioned whether the Town has the manpower to utilize the truck and is not ready to authorize the purchase at this point.

- Folding of tax bills - the Town will quantify the savings for having the County fold the tax bills.

2018 payments for shared services have been approved by the State. After all municipalities have signed off, payment will be forthcoming.

• Solar Zoning Update

The Planning Board (plus John Zerfas and Cindy Dayton) discussed the various regulatory issues to include in the Zoning Amendment to allow and regulate solar farm development in the Town. The following steps are anticipated:

- Draft amendment reviewed by Planning Board at its September meeting.

- Final proposed amendment reviewed by Planning Board at October meeting and recommendation to send to Town Board.

- If acceptable, the Town Board could set a Public Hearing for December.

• Sommerville Valley/Jed Lane

The box culvert was installed at a total cost of \$250,000. The Highway Superintendent added that there was still some guardrail work to be finished.

• NYSERDA Town Center Project

The window installation is approximately 80% complete. A new sign was ordered on 8/26/19.

• Valley Village Road

A Letter of Intent for Valley Village Association, Inc. to take Ownership of Valley Village Road has been drafted. It will be presented at the Valley Village Association meeting next month.

• Water District Extension - adopted on 8/21/19

- New IMA's, laws and rates will be adopted with an effective date of 1/1/20.

- Town will own/control the entire water system and the Village will control the Sewer system.

• EFC Drinking Water Grant

The application for the grant has been submitted.

• Singer PRV Installation'

The water division installed two more Singer PRV's at Buchan Ridge and Plum Ridge.

Tom Scharf - Highway Department

Work Zones

Mr. Scharf stated that people are not slowing down in work zones and it is putting lives in danger. The Board suggested he get the police involved and put up more work zone speed limit signs. He will also put a notice in the paper.

• Town Line Road

360 ton of rock was laid on Townline Road. The Town will get reimbursed for this via a grant.

• 2nd Shift Seasonal Workers

Mr. Scharf would like to hire 2 part-time seasonal workers in the winter to keep the roads safe and eliminate some over-time.

• Nannen Arboretum Paving

The Nannen Arboretum Society thanked the Town for contributing to their paving project. They have agreed to use the extra funds to improve landscaping to eliminate some weed-whacking and to seal the paths every 2 to 3 years.

• Waiver of Marriage License Fees

On August 20th the Governor signed legislation waiving the state fee for marriage licenses for active duty member of the U.S. Armed Forces or their

spouses. The bill also gives local governments freedom to waive the fees they charge for marriage certificates for active duty service member or spouses.

Water District IMA with the Mansfield and Great Valley which assess fees for debt service that is owed from the East Tank project along with a charge per parcel for overhead, management, capital improvement planning and engineering for the water and sewer systems. The Board would like more information and comparisons from last year before they make a decision.
