SEQRA, Proposed Zoning Amendment – Short Term Rentals and proposed Zoning Code Amendment

Zoning amendment is a Type 1 Action and a Full Environmental Assessment Form (EAF), was provided in June. Part 1 establishes the existing conditions and what may change if we adopt the zoning amendment. In short, primary residences can be used for STR without new construction. It (the amendment) is not encouraging any more building than the zoning already allow. Part 2 is to identify any significant environmental impacts that may occur. All of the main questions are checked "no" and proposed action will not have a significant effect. Part 3 of the EAF is where you make your Determination of Significance. This minor zoning amendment does not warrant Positive Declaration. Part 3 is a Negative Declaration. Mr. Palumbo has provided his summary as to why it is a Negative Declaration. The amendment is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan. This (the amendment) will not have a significant adverse environmental impact. Richard Stanton said that SEQR is for the board to discuss and vote on. This (draft document) can always be amended. It is a Type 1 Action because it is Village wide. Mr. Murray is choosing his neighborhood to maintaining what we have and creating for new residents. He stated that we are trying to create the best community. Ms. Lowes agrees with the way we want to keep the village a great place to live and committing to protect the Village residential character. Mr. Cappelli stated that he as been on both sides. Integrity of the Village is very important. The DRI grant is to bring more full time people into the Village. To bring residents in who will spend money into the village 7 days a week. At the DRI presentation they questioned us on what are we doing to bring people in. Taking a stand that we can now enforce short term and helping long term. Mr. DiPasquale agrees with all.
